2. Give yourself credit for starting.

Take a moment to acknowledge the progress you've already made. You started and that is more than most people will ever do.

3. Don't compare yourself to others.

I didn't mention this in the video, but the biggest mistake you can make is to compare your beginning or middle to someone else's polished end.

I love what Steven Furtick says about this insecurity:

The reason we struggle with insecurity is because we compare our behind-the-scenes with everyone else's highlight reel.

Focus on your own race and run it your way. You'll get to your finish line soon enough.
