 Bottom Line Up Front Give the best part first ar
 then give them a reason to keep on reading.
- 2 START WITH A BIG PROMISE

 Make a BIG promise in your first paragraph Get them in the right mindset and keep them reading.
- BE ORIGINAL & USE ENERGETIC LANGUAGE

 Don't use tired language, clichés, or common figures of speech.
- TELL A STORY

 Here's where I was (Struggle) >> Here's where I am now (Success / Open Loop) >> Here's how I got there (Guide / Solution)
- PAINT A VIVID PICTURE

 Your words should spark creative thoughts in the minds of your readers. They should feel like they are in the story
- OUSE SMALL, SIMPLE WORDS

 You are writing to be understood, not to impress your 12th grade English teacher. Replace complicated words with simpler words.
- 7 USE SHORT SENTENCES & PARAGRAPHS
 Sentences should be less than twenty words.
 Paragraphs should be four sentences or less.
- 8 IF YOU CAN ELIMINATE A WORD, DO IT
 Get rid of unnecessary words or phrases. No fluff.
- 9 DON'T USE JARGON

 Avoid uncommon acronyms and industry-speak. If you must use it, explain what it means.
- WRITE IN THE ACTIVE VOICE, NOT PASSIVE

 The character performs the action. The action is not performed to them.
